How often do you talk about gratitude with your kids? I try to make gratitude an ongoing conversation at our house. I don't ever want my girls to take our wonderful life for granted. When I was done, I had a set of Gratitude Conversation Starters to use to get us talking. Attached are a list of questions you can print, cut, and place in a jar in the middle of your table. Every day, when you are around the table together, take turns picking a paper out of the jar and asking one another the questions.

Gratitude Pumpkin

Put a pumpkin in the middle of the table. Buy a different colored marker for each person in the home. Every night at dinner, have each person take turns writing something they are thankful for on the pumpkin. On Thanksgiving Day, read each other's aloud to one another.

The session adopted two documents for the protection of children, youth, and at-risk adults at its October 15th meeting. The "SAS Safe Children Policy" updates our written policies to reflect the practices and procedures the school already has in place. "The Miriam Project" is a child protection policy created by Second Presbyterian Church in Little Rock, Arkansas. We have adapted it to be used by St. Andrews in its ministries with children, youth, and at-risk adults. More information to come about dates for teacher training next year.
