#### RESPONDING TO GOD'S WORD

#### †Affirmation of Faith

What do you believe when you confess your faith in "God the Father Almighty"?

Notes on today's music:

The **Opening Voluntary** is based on a traditional Shaker tune by Joseph Brackett, Jr. an elder of the Shaker community in Alfred, Maine. It was not widely known until being included in *The Gift to be Simple: Songs, Dances, and Rituals of the American Shakers*, The tune rose to wide recognition when Aaron Copland used it in his ballet *Appalachian Spring*.

The text of "For the Beauty of the Earth" was written by F. S. Pierpoint; the original title was "Sacrifice of Priase" and the original refrain was "'Christ our God, to Thee we raise / This our Sacrifice of Praise" which expresses the original intent as a eucharistic hymn. The tune DIX was composed by Conrad Kocher, originally written for the hymn "As with Gladness Men of Old," by W. C. Dix (1837-1898), hence the name of the tune.

The **Musical Offering** is an adaptation of a round for three equal voices by Mozart. The music was edited and adapted with English text by Walter Ehret (1918- 2009), a noted clinician, conductor, and choral literature specialist.

The **Offertory** is based on a tune composed by Robert Lowry, specifically for a poem by Phelps. Lowry was an American poet and gospel music composer.

The author of the text for the **Offertory Response**, a Trinitarian doxology, is unknown, but it was coupled with a traditional Ghanian melody by Alfred Tedak (b. 1953) for use in our *Glory to God* hymnal in 2013.

The **Final Hymn** is based on the text by Thomas Chisholm; it is written as a meditation on Lamentations 2:22-23.

The **Benediction in Music** is the third movement of a suite for organ by Charles Callahan, based on the familiar tunes KREMSER and NUNDANKET ALLE GOTT.
