Following the proclamation of the Word, the congregation is invited to respond to hearing God's Word by affirming what the church believes and expressing our faith. The Theological Declaration of Barmen was written in May of 1934 by church delegates from around Germany to help Christians withstand the challenges of the Nazi party. Written primarily by Karl Barth, this declaration affirms that while Christians must still listen to the surrounding culture, Christ is ultimately the only one to whom the church owes obedience. The church should not hand over its message to the prevailing ideological convictions of the day.

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

HYMN 321

In 19th century England there was great controversy over Biblical interpretation. Samuel Stone wrote this hymn as a plea for unity. This hymn reminds us of the foundation we have in Jesus Christ that unites the church and that the church, for better and worse, is Christ's new creation.

Notes on Today's Music:

The text of **How Firm a Foundation** was first published in London in 1787. The identity of the author of this popular text - identified only as "K" - is one of the unsolved mystery of 18th century English hymnody. The composer of the music is also unknown. This tune, now known as FOUNDATION, is one of most well-know and popular from the shaped note repertory.

The **Musical Offering** is by Anne Krentz Organ, an American composer and church musician serving as the Director of Music Ministries at St. Luke's Lutheran Church in Park Ridge, IL. Her published compositions include fifteen volumes of hymn tune arrangements for piano, additional volumes for piano and instrument, numerous choral pieces, psalm settings, handbell pieces, hymn introductions and alternate accompaniments, and music for congregational singing.

The setting for the **Offertory** was composed by Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750). It is one of 46 chorale preludes for organ from the *Orgalbüchlein* (Little Organ Book). The music was written in 1538 by Martin Luther to set his paraphrase of the Lord's Prayer in 1538, corresponding to his explanation of the prayer in his *Kleiner Katechismus* (Small Catechism).

The Benediction in Music is a setting of the hymn tune ST. AGNES composed by John Bacchus Dykes (1823-1876), an English clergyman and hymnwriter, including "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God Almighty" and "Eternal Father, Strong to Save." The text a translation of a 12th century Latin hymn Raymond Haan (b. 1938) is the Director of Music for the Cutlerville East Christian Reformed Church in Grand Rapids, and has had this position since 1960. He is the composer of hundreds of compositions for organ, voice, choir, handbells, piano, and other instruments.
