Notes on Today's Music:

The *Opening Voluntary* is an arrangement of a movement setting the text of John 3:16-17 from the cantata "The Crucifixion" by Sir John Stainer (1840-1901). Stainer was an English composer and organist whose music, though seldom performed today, was very popular during his lifetime. His work as choir trainer and organist set standards for Anglican church music that are still influential. He was also active as an academic, becoming Professor of Music at Oxford.

The *Musical Offering* was composed by Taylor Davis (b. 1980), currently the Director of Music and Worship at Holy Covenant United Methodist Church in Houston, TX. The text was composed by Georgia Harkness (1891-1974), an American Methodist theologian and philosopher. Harkness has been described as one of the first significant American female theologians and was important in the movement to legalize the ordination of women in American Methodism.

Offertory Melchior Vulpius (1570-1615) composed this short chorale tune, published as a setting for the anonymous funeral hymn "Christus, der ist mein Leben" (Christ, You are My Life). He was a highly regard composer whose works included nearly two hundred motets in German and Latin, and over four hundred hymn tunes.

This setting is by Johann Pachelbel (1653-1706), a German composer, organist, and teacher who brought the south German organ school to its peak. He composed a large body of sacred and secular music, and his contributions to the development of the chorale prelude and fugue have earned him a place among the most important composers of the middle Baroque era.

Benediction in Music "Jesu, meine Freude" (Jesus, my Joy) is a German hymn written by Johann Franck, a lyric poet and hymnist, in 1650 The hymn tune was composed by Johann Crüger (1598-1662), a composer of well-known hymns. He was also the editor of the most widely used Lutheran hymnal of the 17th century, Praxis pietatis melica.
