

Notes on Today's Music:

The text for the hymn that is the basis for the **Opening Voluntary** was written by Washington Gladden. Throughout his ministry he emphasized applying the gospel to life in America. He wrote *O Master, let me walk with thee* in 1879. The music was composed by Henry Percy Smith (1825-1898) a priest in the Church of England. The name for the tune, MARYTON, is his only tune found in contemporary hymnals and is thought to be the only tune he published.

The lyrics and music for the **Musical Offering** were composed by Allen Pote (b. 1945), which focuses on the fact that although we are all different we are united through God's love. Pote is known nationally as a composer of sacred music as well as a clinician for festivals and workshops. Since 1975 his published choral works, which include twelve musicals for youth and children, have been widely performed; and he continues to receive numerous commissions for new works. "Many Gifts, One Spirit" was commissioned for the Music Department of First United Methodist Church, Shreveport, Louisiana; Dr, Will Andress, Director of Fine Arts.

The **Offertory**, *Jesu, meine Freude*, is a German hymn written by Johann Franck, a lyric poet and hymnist, in 1650. The hymn tune was composed by Johann Crüger, who was also the editor of the most widely used Lutheran hymnal of the 17th century, *Praxis pietatis melica*. The setting was composed by Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750). It is from the *Orgelbüchlein* (Little Organ Book), a set of 46 chorale preludes for organ. They are intended as introductions for the hymn to be sung.

The text for the hymn that is the basis for **Benediction in Music** was written by Joseph Swain (1761-1796) of London. Swain was a British Baptist minister, poet and hymn writer. The words speak to the presence of the Lord as a comfort in times of trial. The music was composed by Freeman Lewis (1780-1859) who was a surveyor, writer, and traveling school teacher who played the organ and wrote music on the side. He compiled and published a book of camp meeting hymns and other sacred music: *The Beauties of Harmony* (1813), which included some of his own compositions.

As one part of the church of Jesus Christ, we are inspired and guided by Christ's vision of God's realm – one that includes all who seek to love God and neighbor.
