Notes on this week's music:

The **Opening Voluntary** is a chorale setting by Johann Ludwig Krebs, a German Baroque musician and composer for organ, harpsichord, other instruments and orchestras. Krebs studied with Johann Sebastian Bach who held him in high standing as an organist. The text for the chorale "Lord God, We All Praise You" was written by Paul Eber in 1554. Eber studied with Martin Luther at Wittenberg graduating from the University in 1536. The composer of the melody is unknown.

The text and the music of the **Musical Offering** are from the pen of Kathleen Thomerson. As a writer of hymns, she is best known for the text "I Want to Walk as a Child of the Light," written in the summer of 1966 after a visit to the Church of the Redeemer in Houston and set to her own tune HOUSTON. Thomerson received bachelor and master degrees from the University of Texas and continued her organ studies with renowned organists Flor Peeters in Antwerp and Jean Langlais in Paris.

The text of the hymn that is the basis of the **Offertory**, "Break Thou, the Bread of Life," was written by Mary Lathbury set to the music composed by William Fish Sherwin, both of whom were active in the Chautauqua Assembly. The setting is by Seth Daniels Bingham, an American organist and prolific composer. Bingham earned his B.Mus. from Yale in 1908, and subsequently taught theory, composition and organ at Yale. Beginning in 1913, he was organist and choirmaster at Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church in New York City, a position he held until his 1951 retirement.
