# ALL THINGS BRIGHT AND BEAUTIFUL

Written almost 200 years ago, this beloved hymn was originally part of an effort to help children understand the Apostles' Creed. The final stanza shifts the focus to the singers—we who have been given the ability to observe these wonders have also been given the ability and responsibility to praise God.

#### APOSTLES' CREED

This ancient creed, which has its roots in Pentecost, states central mysteries without precisely explaining them. The early church originally used this creed responsively at baptism. Its current form was fixed through efforts of Charlemagne in 814.

The origin of this hymn
dates to Sweden in 1885.
Stuart Hine translated it
into English in many years
later and added verses after
World War II broke out in
1939. The version we know
today became popular when
George Beverly Shea introduced it during a Billy Graham Crusade. It didn't appear in a Presbyterian hymnal until 1990.

## Notes on Today's Music

The text for the **Offertory**, "For the Beauty of the Earth" was written by Folliott Sandford Pierpoint (1835-1917) and first published in London in 1864. The original title was "Sacrifice of Praise" and the original refrain was ""Christ our God, to Thee we raise / This our Sacrifice of Praise" which expresses the original intent as a eucharistic hymn. The tune DIX was composed by Conrad Kocher (1786-1872). It was originally composed for the hymn "As with Gladness Men of Old" by William Chatterton Dix (1837-1898), hence the name of the tune. This setting was arranged for piano and organ by the team of Tedd Smith (b. 1927; London, Ontario, Canada) and Don Hustad (1918-2013).

The text for the **Benediction in Music** "This is My Father's World" was written by Maltbie D. Babcock (1858-1901) and is from a collection of this Presbyterian's pastor's writings which was published posthumously. The recurring phrase was his customary was of identifying what he was going out to see on his morning walks. The tune TERRA BEATA was composed by Franklin L. Sheppard (1852-1930) for these words by a friend of the author It first appeared in a Presbyterian Sunday School hymnal (1915) which the composer edited. The setting is by Dale Wood (1934-2003), an American composer, organist, and choral director best known for his church music.
