Yet, even in the midst of conflict and fear this hymn attests that we can join with others and give thanks to God

OFFERTORY RESPONSE

The text for the Offertory Response was written by Neil Weatherhogg, a Presbyterian pastor, in 1988 as a nongendered adaptation of the familiar words of the Doxology. The music was composed by Hal Hopson, a full-time composer, church musician, conductor, and clinician.

Notes on Today's Music

Opening Voluntary "Vater unser im Himmelreich" (Our Father in Heaven) is a Lutheran hymn in German by Martin Luther (1483-1546). He wrote it as a paraphrase of the Lord's Prayer in 1538, dedicating one stanza to each of the seven petitions of the prayer and framed it with an opening and a closing stanza. The hymn was published in Leipzig in 1539 in Valentin Schumann's (d. 1542) hymnal Gesangbuch. This setting was composed by Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750). It is from the *Orgelbüchlein* (Little Organ Book), a set of 46 chorale preludes for organ. They are intended as introductions for the hymn to be sung. Bach originally planned for a collection of 164 settings of existing Lutheran chorale tunes sung during the Church year so that each part of the year was represented.

The text for the **Joyful Response** was written by John B. Renvile (1830-1903), the first First Peoples Dakota to be ordained to the Presbyterian ministry, and was published in Dakota Odowan [Dakota Hymns] (New York, 1879). Both the Dakota version and English translation have been associated with this familiar late 18th century American tune.

The **Benediction in Music** was composed by William Boyce (1710-1779), probably the foremost English composer of the eight-eenth century. Beginning his career in music as a chorister at St. Paul's Cathedral, he went on to become organist at various London churches. He became composer to the Chapel Royal in 1736, was made Doctor of Music at Cambridge in 1749, and was appointed Master of the King's Music in 1755. Upon his death in February, 1779, he was buried in St. Paul's This is one of ten voluntaries published posthumously in an undated collection between 1779 and 1793.
