The text for the Offertory Response was written by Neil Weatherhogg, a Presbyterian pastor, in 1988 as a nongendered adaptation of the familiar words of the Doxology. The music was composed by Hal Hopson, a full-time composer, church musician, conductor, and clinician.

Notes on Today's Music

The **Opening Voluntary** is a setting of the hymn tune ST. AGNES composed by John Bacchus Dykes (1823-1876), an English clergyman and hymnwriter, among which are "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God Almighty" and "Eternal Father, Strong to Save." The text a translation of a 12th century Latin hymn Raymond Haan (b. 1938) is the Director of Music for the Cutlerville East Christian Reformed Church in Grand Rapids, and has had this position since 1960. He is the composer of hundreds of compositions for organ, voice, choir, handbells, piano, and other instruments.

The text for the **Joyful Response** was written by David Gambrell (b.1972) as a paraphrase of Psalm 51. The composer of the tune is unknown. It first appeared in a collection of hymns and poems publish in Dublin (hence the name of the tune) in 1749.

The **Benediction in Music**, "Be Thou My Vision," which is *Rop tú mo baile*, a *Choimdiu cride* in Irish Gaelic, is preserved in two manuscripts (National Library of Ireland and the Royal Irish Academy) both dating from the 10th or 11th century. This prayer-hymn belongs to a special category know as a lorica, a Latin word meaning "armor" or "breastplate." Clearly referencing Ephesians 6:11-18, such prayers are understood to be an incantation of divine protection. The author is unknown and is likely to have been an anonymous Irish monk from around the 8th century. The rhymed version we use was translated by Eleanor Hull in 1912. The music is a traditional Irish folk tune first combined with Hull's couplets in the Irish Church Hymnal (Dublin, 1919). The combination soon appeared in a number of British hymnals and first appeared in North America in a Canadian hymnal published in 1930.
