AMAZING GRACE

John Newton wrote the text to this popular hymn to accompany a sermon preached on 1 Chronicles 17:16-17. These verses record David reflecting on the message from the prophet Nathan, remembering how he was raised up from a lowly shepherd and how he would not see his hopes for the future realized. The hymn and sermon deal with the consideration of both past mercies and future hopes.

Notes on Today's Music

Opening Voluntary A common theme of the Psalms is the urge to break into song in praise of the Lord. This piece sets two of those texts to exuberant music. It was composed by Kenneth Jennings (1925-2015), who directed the St. Olaf Choir from 1968 until his retirement in 1990. Under his direction the St. Olaf Choir developed from a small college ensemble into one of the world's most highly respected choral ensembles.

Musical Offering Composer Dan Forrest (b. 1978) is the former chairman of the Bob Jones University Department of Music Theory and Composition and is now an associate editor at Beckenhorst Press. His award-winning choral works have been performed in such venues as Carnegie Hall and Lincoln Center. This joyful piece is based on Zephaniah 3: 17: "The LORD will take great delight in you; in His love He will rejoice over you with singing." Lyricist Susan Bentall Boersma is a Michigander who has published both sacred and secular music with multiple popular composers. She is also an accomplished accompanist (piano and organ) for college choirs, touring groups, solo artists, and community choirs.

Benediction in Music Until his untimely death 19 years ago, the Oberlin- and Julliard-trained Moses Hogan (1957-2003) served as Artist-in-Residence at Loyola University in New Orleans and director of the Moses Hogan Singers and Moses Hogan Chorale. He gained acclaim as a pianist, conductor, and arranger – especially of spirituals – and edited The Oxford Book of Spirituals. This original composition in the style of a jubilant spiritual proclaims the heart-bursting joy that results from the movement of the Holy Spirit – bringing the grace and love that will lead us home.
