#### Notes on Today's Music

The **Opening Voluntary** is based on the hymn tune AMSTERDAM first published in the *Foundery Collection*, 1742. The text for the hymn was written by Charles Wesley (1707-1788), the great hymn-writer of the Wesley family, and perhaps, taking quantity and quality into consideration, the great hymn-writer of all ages. The *Foundery Collection* was so named because the Wesleys purchased an unused cannon foundry and restored it as a gathering center for preaching and learning. In essence, it is the first distinctly Methodist hymn book.

The **Musical Offering** is a traditional Spiritual arranged by André Thomas (b. 1952). Dr. Thomas is an internationally sought after conductor, composer, choral director, and for 35 years, the Professor of Music and Director of Choral Activities at Florida State University. He was recently named Associate Artist with the London Symphony Orchestra where he will be conducting concerts of Gospel choral music and a program of purely orchestral music featuring works by African American artists, including compositions by Wynton Marsalis and Adolphus Hailstock.

The **Benediction in Music** was composed by Samuel Wesley (1766-1837), an English organist and composer in the late Georgian period. Wesley was a contemporary of Mozart (1756–1791) and was called by some "the English Mozart." He was the son of noted Methodist hymnodist Charles Wesley and the nephew of John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist Church. He had seven children, among them Samuel Sebastian Wesley (1810–1876) who was a cathedral organist and notable composer.

A **Voluntary** is a distinctly English term for pieces intended to be played in connection with the church service. The earliest printed voluntaries date from around 1550 and referred to pieces that were largely improvisatory. By the eighteenth century, it had evolved to usually containing a slow and a fast movement; however, this piece is an example of a single movement.

As one part of the church of Jesus Christ, we are inspired and guided by Christ's vision of God's realm – one that includes all who seek to love God and neighbor.
