
PRAYER OF CONFESSION

DECLARATION OF FORGIVENESS

This declaration is adapted from the liturgy John Calvin used in churches he served in Geneva and Strasbourg (circa 1542).

SCRIPTURE RESPONSE

After each scripture reading the reader will say, "The Word of the Lord." All are invited to respond, "Thanks be to God."

THERE'S A WIDENESS IN GOD'S MERCY

This text reminds us that the God we love and serve is "ready to forgive, gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love" (Nehemiah 9:17b). When we confess, God who is "faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9). There is no limit to God's mercy and grace.

We believe that God has revealed himself as the one who wishes to bring about justice and true peace among people;

that God, in a world full of injustice and enmity, is in a special way the God of the destitute, the poor and the wronged;

that God calls the church to follow in this; for God brings justice to the oppressed and gives bread to the hungry;

that God supports the downtrodden, protects the stranger, helps orphans and widows and blocks the path of the ungodly;

that God wishes to teach the church to do what is good and to seek the right; that the church must therefore stand by people in any form of suffering and need, which implies, among other things, that the church must witness against and strive against any form of injustice, so that justice may roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream;

that the church as the possession of God must stand where the Lord stands, namely against injustice and with the wronged; that in following Christ the church must witness against all the powerful and privileged who selfishly seek their own interests and thus control and harm others.

Therefore, we reject any ideology which would legitimate forms of injustice and any doctrine which is unwilling to resist such an ideology in the name of the gospel.

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

The Confession of Belhar is a powerful confession of the Christian faith that emerged in South Africa during Apartheid. Named for the city where it was first adopted, it is a statement that focuses on the themes of Unity, Reconciliation, and Justice. Churches around the globe have recognized the power and theological insight of Belhar as an expression of Scriptural truth for their contexts. In 2016 the 222nd General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) formally adopted the confession into our Book of Confessions.

AMAZING GRACE

John Newton wrote the text to this popular hymn to accompany a sermon preached on 1 Chronicles 17:16-17. These verses record David reflecting on the message from the prophet Nathan, remembering how he was raised from a lowly shepherd and how he would not see his hopes for the future realized.
