It trusts and obeys the power of the Word by which God upholds all things.

We reject the false doctrine, as though the State, over and beyond its special commission, should and could become the single and totalitarian order of human life, thus fulfilling the church's vocation as well.

We reject the false doctrine, as though the church, over and beyond its special commission, should and could appropriate the characteristics, the tasks, and the dignity of the State, thus itself becoming an organ of the State.

The church's commission, upon which its freedom is founded, consists in delivering the message of the free grace of God to all people in Christ's stead, and therefore in the ministry of his own Word and work through sermon and Sacrament.

In Matthew 25:40, Jesus says, "I assure you that when you have done it for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you have done it for me." This hymn captures what it looks like when we follow this call. United by the refrain after each stanza, this text relies on passages from Matthew and Luke to highlight various dimensions of the church's mission and ministry in the world.

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Following the proclamation of the Word, the congregation is given the opportunity to respond to hearing God's Word by affirming what the church believes and expressing our faith. Today's responsive affirmation is adapted from The Theological Declaration of Barmen, which was written to help Christians withstand the challenges of the Nazi party In May of 1934 delegates representing Lutheran, Reformed, and United churches from around Germany assembled in the town of Barmen to proclaim their faith in Jesus Christ. The Declaration, written primarily by Karl Barth, affirmed that while Christians must still listen to the surrounding culture, Christ is ultimately the only one to whom the church owes obedience. The church should not hand over its message to the prevailing ideological convictions of the day.
