This ancient creed, which has its roots in Pentecost, states central mysteries without precisely explaining them. The early church originally used this creed responsively at baptism. Its current form was fixed through efforts of Charlemagne in 814.

Notes on Today's Music

The text of **How Firm a Foundation** was first published in London in 1787. The identity of the author of this popular text - identified only as "K" - is one of the unsolved mystery of 18th century English hymnody.

The composer of the music is also unknown. It first appeared in *A Compilation of Genuine Church Music* edited by Joseph Funk (Winchester, Virginia, 1832) where the name of the tune was PROTECTION. This tune, now known as FOUNDATION, based on a pentatonic (five note) scale, is one of most well-known and popular from the shaped note repertory.

The text of **Great Is Thy Faithfulness** was written by Thomas Chisholm (1866-1960), a Methodist writer and pastor. Written as a meditation on Lamentations 2:22-23, it was first published in *Songs of Salvation and Service* (Chicago, 1923) and was combined with the music composed specifically for it by William Runyan (1870-1957) who was also a Methodist pastor.

This arrangement is by John Helgen, an American organist, pianist, composer, and conductor. He currently serves as Director of Music Ministry at Roseville Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

The **Benediction in Music** is based on the Lutheran chorale, "Was Gott tut, das ist wohlgetan," (literal translation: What God does, that is well done) and was written by the pietist German poet and schoolmaster, Samuel Rodigast (1649-1708). The melody has been attributed to Severus Gastorius (1646-1682), a cantor in the town of Jena, Thuringia, a state in Germany.

This setting was composed by Johann Gottfried Walther (1684 – 1748), a German music theorist, organist, composer, and lexicographer of the Baroque era. Not only was his life almost exactly contemporaneous to that of Johann Sebastian Bach, he was the famous composer's cousin. He is considered among the most distinguished musical scholars of his time. His *Musicalisches Lexicon* was the first important comprehensive German music dictionary.

As one part of the church of Jesus Christ, we are inspired and guided by Christ's vision of God's realm – one that includes all who seek to love God and neighbor.
