Francis Havergal, author of Take My Life, wrote this text as a poem entitled "A Worker's Prayer." Each stanza is a request that God will empower the people to live and serve as Christ's own.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

This ancient creed, which has its roots in Pentecost, states central mysteries without precisely explaining them. The early church originally used this creed responsively at baptism. Its current form was fixed through efforts of Charlemagne in 814.

LOVE DIVINE, ALL LOVES EXCELLING

Charles Wesley reworked a song from John Dryden's opera King Arthur to craft this now-beloved hymn. "Fairest Isle, all isles excelling" is a song sung by Venus, the mythological goddess of love. Wesley believed that nothing was beyond redemption or could not be enlisted for God's purposes, so he turned these words and rhymes into a hymn celebrating the true divine Love.

Notes on Today's Music

The tune for the **Opening Voluntary** is attributed to William Moore (ca. 1790 - ca. 1850). It first appeared in *The Columbian Harmony* (Cincinnati, 1825), a collection of shaped note Appalachian tunes, of which Moore was the editor. Like many folk tunes and spirituals, HOLY MANNA, is based on a five-note (pentatonic) scale and its AABA structure makes it easy to learn, sing, and remember. The name derives from the text of "Brethren, We Have Met to Worship," attributed to George Askins (d. 1816), a Methodist pastor who was an itinerant preacher for the Baltimore Conference.

The setting is by Dale Wood (1934-2003), an American composer, organist, and choral director best known for his church music compositions.

The **Musical Offering** was composed by Cindy Berry, an American composer and arranger of sacred choral anthems for all voicings, for children's anthems, and piano collections for several major publishers.

The music for the **Offertory Response** was composed by Hal Hopson (b. 1933), a full-time composer, church musician, conductor, and clinician. He has over 3000 published works, which comprise almost every musical form in church music. With a special interest in congregational song, he continues to make a significant contribution to the new repertoire of hymn tunes and responsorial psalm settings.

The **Benediction in Music** was composed by Alan Bullard (b.1947), a British composer known mainly for his choral and educational music. His compositions are regularly performed and broadcast worldwide, and they appear on a number of recordings.

As one part of the church of Jesus Christ, we are inspired and guided by Christ's vision of God's realm – one that includes all who seek to love God and neighbor.
