#### AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

The Confession of Belhar is a powerful confession of the Christian faith that emerged in South Africa during the years of Apartheid. Named for the city where it was first adopted, it is a statement that focuses on the themes of Unity, Reconciliation, and Justice. Churches around the globe have recognized the power and theological insight of Belhar as an expression of Scriptural truth for their own contexts. In 2016 the 222<sup>nd</sup> General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) formally adopted the confession into our The Book of Confessions.

#### SHINE, JESUS, SHINE

This song, written in 1988, incorporates a variety of scriptural images (John 1:5; Hebrews 13:20-21; Psalm 139:23; and 2 Corinthians 3:18; Isaiah 11:9; Habakkuk 2:14) to explore. The refrain continues the light-based imagery, making it appropriate for Jesus' Transfiguration (Matthew 17:1-9).

#### Notes on Today's Music

The **Opening Voluntary** is based on a tune which is believed to be from the Glaz district of Silesia and was first published a collection *Schleisische Volksleider mit Melodien* (Silesian folk songs with melodies) published in Leipzig, 1842. The version we sing was harmonized by Richard Willis for Songs of the Church (New York, 1862). Willis mistakenly attributed the tune to the twelfth century when in fact it was from the early 1800's. The tune earned the moniker CRUSADER'S HYMN when Franz Liszt used it in his oratorio *The Legend of St. Elizabeth* (1862) for a march of Crusader knights.

The text and music for the **Musical Offering** were composed by Michael Helman (b 1956), an American composer of handbell, organ, and choral music with well over 140 pieces. He is currently Director of Music/Organist at Faith Presbyterian Church in Cape Coral, Florida, where he directs the adult vocal choirs, conducts a graded handbell program for children through adults, and coordinates the church's Concert Series.

As one part of the church of Jesus Christ, we are inspired and guided by Christ's vision of God's realm – one that includes all who seek to love God and neighbor.
