Notes on Today's Music:

The **Opening Voluntary** and **Benediction in Music** were composed by Hermann Schröder (1904–1984), a German composer and a Catholic church musician. His main sphere of activity as composer, conductor and organist were supplemental to his work as a professor of choral conducting, counterpoint, and composition. Schroeder is one of the most important German composers of the 20th century for organ. His music combines elements of the Middle Ages with 20th century polyphony.

The **Musical Offering** was composed in 1999 by Craig Courtney (b. 1948) based on words from Job 19:25-26 and I Corinthians 13:12 and employing the Alleluia from EASTER HYMN as an opening and closing motif. He is currently a Composer and the Executive Music Editor for Beckenhorst Press, and his music is performed all over the world. His published works include more than two hundred choral octavos, nine vocal collections, a piano solo collection and six extended works for choir and orchestra.
