Notes on Today's Music:

The text for the **Opening Voluntary,** "This is My Father's World," was written by Maltbie D. Babcock (1858-1901) and is from a collection of this Presbyterian's pastor's writings which was published posthumously. The recurring phrase was his customary was of identifying what he was going out to see on his morning walks. The tune TERRA BEATA was composed by Franklin L. Sheppard (1852-1930), a friend of the author, for these words. It first appeared in a Presbyterian Sunday School hymnal (1915) which the composer edited.

The text for the **Musical Offering,** "For the Beauty of the Earth," was written by Folliott Sandford Pierpoint (1835-1917) and first published in London in 1864. The original title was "Sacrifice of Praise" and the original refrain was "Christ our God, to Thee we raise / This our Sacrifice of Praise" which expresses the original intent as a eucharistic hymn.

This setting is by John Rutter (b. 1945), an internationally renowned English composer and conductor, associated mainly with choral music. His larger choral works, *Gloria, Requiem, Magnificat and Mass of the Children* are widely performed around the world, and many of his shorter pieces such as *The Lord bless you and keep you*, *For the beauty of the earth, and All things bright and beautiful* have become 'standards'. He has also composed or arranged many Christmas carols.

Be Thou My Vision - Rop tú mo baile, a Choimdiu cride in Irish Gaelic - is preserved in two manuscripts (National Library of Ireland and the Royal Irish Academy) both dating from the 10th or 11th century. This prayer-hymn belongs to a special category know as a lorica, a Latin word meaning "armor" or "breastplate." Clearly referencing Ephesians 6:11-18, such prayers are understood to be an incantation of divine protection. The author is unknown and is likely the work of an anonymous Irish monk from around the 8th century. The rhymed version we use was translated by Eleanor Hull in 1912. The music is a traditional Irish folk tune first combined with Hull's couplets in the Irish Church Hymnal (Dublin, 1919). The combination soon appeared in a number of British hymnals and first appeared in North America in a Canadian hymnal published in 1930.
