LET ALL THINGS NOW LIVING The Welsh folk melody, ASH GROVE, is known by many from the Avery and Marsh songbook from camp. The tune fits well with the text, singing praise for God's creation and providence.

#### APOSTLES' CREED

This ancient creed, which has its roots in Pentecost, states central mysteries without precisely explaining them. The early church originally used this creed responsively at baptism. Its current form was fixed through the efforts of Charlemagne in 814.

COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

In the act of remembering that is the Lord's Supper, we receive and trust the love of Christ present to us and the world. Through it, we are renewed and empowered to be the church, the body of Christ, in the world.

The invitation is not just for Presbyterians or "church members." Access to the Table is not a right conferred upon the worthy but a privilege given to the undeserving who come in faith, repentance, and love. All are invited to receive the bread and cup, regardless of age or understanding, to be assured of God's love and grace in Jesus Christ.

Today, communion will be served by intinction. Congregants proceed via the center aisle to receive the bread (gluten-free bread and individual cups of juice are available), which they then dip into the chalice of nonalcoholic grape juice. Worshipers return to their pews by the side aisles. If you are unable to come forward to receive communion, we will come to you in your seat.

Notes on Today's Music:

The **Opening Voluntary** by César-Auguste Jean-Guillaume Hubert Franck (1822-1890) a French Romantic composer, pianist, organist, and music teacher born in modern-day Belgium. In 1858, he became organist at the Basilica of St. Clotilde, Paris, a position he retained for the rest of his life. He became professor at the Paris Conservatoire in 1872. Franck wrote several pieces that have entered the standard classical repertoire, including symphonic, chamber, and keyboard works for pipe organ and piano. The text was written by Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274) for the feast of Corpus Christi. He has been described as "the most influential thinker of the medieval period" and "the greatest of the medieval philosopher-theologians."

The lyrics for the **Musical Offering** were written by Joel Nagy and set to music by his brother Russell Nagy in 1992. Joel has written many of the texts for which Russ has composed the music Russ is a published composer of both sacred and secular music his compositions range from choral octavos to film scores, marching band arrangements to full-length musicals. A champion of music for children, he has composed hundreds of compositions from Bible verse memory songs. He currently serves as the President of Gracewood Publishing in Columbus, Ohio.

The **Benediction in Music** is based on the hymn tune AZMON by Carl Gotthelf Gläser (1784-1829) and was first published in The Modern Psalmist (Boston, 1839) which was complied and edited by Lowell Mason (1792-1872). It is most familiar to use with the words of "O for a Thousand Tongues to Sing" by Charles Wesley (1797-1788). This setting is by Anna Laura Page (b. 1943), who is active as a composer, clinician, and organist. Her publications include choral works for children, youth and adults, and compositions for handbells, organ, and piano.
