BENEDICTION IN MUSIC God Moves in a Mysterious Way Setting by Roy Brunner

The Nicene Creed is the most ecumenical of creeds, with Eastern Orthodox, Roman Catholic, and most Protestant churches affirming it. Western churches state that the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. The Eastern Orthodox Church omits the phrase "and the Son" (Latin, filioque) from that portion of the creed because they believe it threatens the distinctiveness of the Holy Spirit.

Notes on Today's Music:

The music and the text for the **Musical Offering** are by Michael Joncas (b. 1951). Jan Michael Joncas is a Catholic priest of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis, liturgical theologian, and composer of contemporary Catholic music. The text is an adaptation of Psalm 91.

The arrangement is by Mark Hayes (b. 1953), an award-winning American composer and arranger. His predominant output is choral music in the Christian sacred music and gospel music genres.

The **Benediction in Music** is based on the tune DUNDEE from the *Scottish Psalter*, 1615, published in Edinburgh by Andro Hart. DUNDEE was one of that hymnal's twelve "common tunes"; that is, it was not associated with a specific psalm. In the Psalter Hymnal the tune is in isorhythmic form (all equal rhythms) and has a harmonization that was published in Thomas Ravenscroft's *Whole Booke of Psalmes* (1621). The tune's name comes from the city of Dundee, known as the "Scottish Geneva" during the era of the Scottish Reformation.

Roy Brunner (b. 1945), is an American composer and organist who is currently organist of historic Park Street Church (Congregational) on the Boston Common. He recently retired as Professor of Music at Gordon College, Wenham, Massachusetts.
