Are You Intimidated? Serving at Clifton Sanctuary Ministries by Phyllis Bearden

If you think you have to make a big meal or possibly interact with people you don't know, do you avoid those situations? Confession here: I was so intimidated at one point about providing meals for the homeless that it made me anxious. Some really great St. Andrews people mentored me and coached me along until I became the one making sure a meal for the clients of Clifton Sanctuary Ministry would be provided.

You don't like to cook? You doubt you could cook for 15 people? Do you worry about interacting with formerly unhoused people? We can coach you through it all. For starters, you don't have to cook a big meal. All that needs to be done, once a month, is to figure out a menu and get people to provide an item. For instance, on May 28th we took chicken casseroles provided by two people, and Stouffers helped us out there. One person donated bagged salad, one brought rolls, and dessert was the leftover cookies from the graduation celebration.

To be honest, I do like to cook, and I was able to bring up three boys who didn't starve. But cooking a large dish used to be intimidating for me until I figured out I didn't have to be the only one cooking. I've been part of meals that are baked chicken, hamburgers and hot dogs, and when I go solo, there is always pizza.

The first times that I went to the Journey night shelter, I was amazed at how naturally some people could sit down and have a meal and conversation with people less fortunate. Now I realize we are all people, fortunate and unfortunate. Some people are talkative and friendly and some people are not. Some people have marvelous stories to tell, and others are great at listening.

On a personal note, as I have been on my Christian journey, I see that more and more people believe that we as Christians need to listen to the Holy Spirit to be the "hands and feet" of Christ. Providing a meal and thirty lunch bags on the fourth Sunday of each month feels like the right thing to do, in partnership with friends and the Holy Spirit. My prayer is more people will become involved and feel the blessings I have. The Mission Ministry, Mike Bearden, and I, his fortunate wife, are here to help you be a part of the mission of St. Andrews Presbyterian Church.
