I COME WITH JOY

The Lord's Supper is a joyful feast of the people of God. This hymn encourages and invites us to gather at the Lord's table with joy and receive the meal as the gift that it is.

COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

In the act of remembering that is the Lord's Supper, we receive and trust the love of Christ present to us and to the world. Through it, we are renewed and empowered to be the church, the body of Christ, in the world.

The invitation to the Lord's Supper is not just for Presbyterians or "members of the church." All who confess Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord are invited to partake of the Lord's Supper. Access to the Table is not a right conferred upon the worthy but a privilege given to the undeserving who come in faith, repentance, and love. Even one who doubts or whose trust is wavering may receive the bread and grape juice (in place of wine) to be assured of God's love and grace in Iesus Christ.


All are invited to the Lord's Table to receive Communion, which is served by intinction. Congregants proceed via the center aisle to receive the bread (glutenfree bread and individual cups of juice are available at the center station), which they then dip into the chalice of nonalcoholic grape juice. Worshipers return to their pews by the side aisles. If you are unable to come forward to receive communion, we will come to you in your seat.

SHARING THE PEACE OF CHRIST

Because we have been forgiven in Christ, we can forgive one another. We demonstrate this by sharing Christ's peace with one another.

#### Notes on Today's Music:

The tune for the **Opening Voluntary** is attributed to William Moore (19th century). It first appeared in *The Columbian Harmony*, a collection of shaped note Appalachian tunes, of which Moore was the editor. Like many folk tunes and spirituals, HOLY MANNA, is based on a five-note (pentatonic) scale and its AABA structure makes it easy to learn, sing, and remember. The name derives from the text of "Brethren, We Have Met to Worship" attributed to George Askins (d. 1816), a Methodist pastor who was an itinerant preacher for the Baltimore Conference.

The text of the **Musical Offering** by Richard Leach b. 1953, an American hymn writer and poet is based on John 6:22-59. He received a M.Div. from Princeton Theological Seminary in 1978 and served as a United Church of Christ pastor in Connecticut. The music was composed by Roy Hopp (b. 1951), the Director of Music at Woodlawn Christian Reformed Church in Grand Rapids, MI and Adjunct Professor of Choral Music at Calvin Theological Seminary, where he directs the Calvin Theological Seminary Choir. His hymn tunes have been published in hymnals and collections in the United States, Canada, England, Wales and Scotland.

The **Benediction in Music** is based on the tune ST. PETER composed by Alexander Reinagle (1799-1877). It was originally created as a setting for Psalm 118 for solo voice and piano and published in *Psalm Tune for Voice and Pianoforte*. Reinagle revised it as a four part hymn for its appearance in *Hymns Ancient and Modern* (London, 1861). Craig Sellar Lang (1891 - 1971) was a British organist, music teacher, and composer. Born in New Zealand, C. S. Lang (as he is generally known) worked as Director of Music at Christ's Hospital in Horsham, West Sussex. He was an Associate of the Royal College of Music and received his Doctorate of Music from The University of Durham.
