Ministry Spotlight: Fall BBQ



From the Pastor

When journalist and author Mitch Albom began visiting his college professor, Morrie Schwartz, he noticed that folks who visited him, trying to cheer the dying man up, left feeling like they were the ones whose spirits were lifted. When Albom asked about this, Schwartz said, "Giving makes me feel like living." Schwartz had a lot to teach his former student about life and living. Many of those lessons can be applied to our life together as a church.

Giving is an integral part of living as a community of faith. This year, we'll focus on what it means to be a vital and thriving congregation. We will resume our work with the Vital Congregations Initiative this fall. We will explore what it means to thrive and how each of us plays a part in the congregation's life. The dictionary will tell you

that to be **vital** is to be essential or full of energy. It will also tell you that to **thrive** is to grow or develop. To be a *vital* and *thriving* congregation is to grow and flourish. The church thrives on gratitude and responds with generosity. This cycle of gratitude and generosity helps the church to flourish, to be vital, and to thrive.

As we talk more about how we support a vital and thriving congregation with our time, talents, and treasure, I want to start by sharing exciting news. We are on track to be debt-free in 2024! I know those of you who have been through all the capital campaigns and building projects have anxiously awaited this day. We will let everyone know when paying off our mortgage is finalized, but you can be sure that we will celebrate! For 15 years, we've been paying the mortgage that funded new mission initiatives and significant improvements to our buildings and campus with your generous gifts.

We look forward to using your gifts to grow our mission with our annual budget. We invite those of you who have been making an additional gift to the mortgage fund to prayerfully consider continuing to give some or all that amount with your annual pledge to the operating budget.

This month, you will be hearing more about how yourgifts to St. Andrews have been spent during the past year and about plans for using your gifts in 2024. We will celebrate the generosity of this congregation and the ways in which Christ is working in and through us. The goal of the Annual Generosity campaign is quite simple—we want to receive pledges of financial gifts to support the salaries and benefits for our pastoral, program, and support staff; support our mission and outreach; provide for worship, Christian education, and nurture for all ages; and to continue to be good stewards of our physical plant.

On October 22^{nd,} we will celebrate pledge dedication in worship. We ask you to prayerfully consider what kind of financial commitment you can make to Christ's mission and ministry at St. Andrews in 2024. Vital Congregations Initiative

In November 2021 St. Andrews' session voted join the PC(USA) to Vital Congregations Initiative (VCI), a program designed to help revitalize churches through Spirit-led discipleship and the rebuilding of relationships. A two-year process walks churches through the steps of pursuing God's direction and power in setting the path forward toward new life and vitality. St. Andrews began the journey with a Lenten series in Spring of 2022.



We re-enter the first year of the VCI program this month with a church-wide bible study: "Seven Marks of Vital Congregations." We are asking every member to engage with this study. Join Sunday Morning Together, beginning October 8, as they engage the study each Sunday at 8:45. Other groups may form, or you may study on your own using our "Seven Marks of Vital Congregations" study guide available in the narthex, beginning October 1st.

Several other VCI activities this fall will further our pursuit of vitality: In October and November we'll examine St. Andrews' in the past, with historical remembrances. In December and January other activities with help us see clearly who we are now. And in the Spring, we'll turn toward spiritual discernment as we seek what God is calling SAPC to be.

We need everyone to be united in this effort to seek God's quickening and leading, that St. Andrews may regain its vitality and relevance, and be fully alive with the Spirit of Christ. So stay tuned and get involved in all of our Vital Congregations Initiative activities.

In August, our income was \$31,394.00 and our expenses totaled \$44,194.45. Year to date, our income was \$311,982.71 and our expenses were \$274,954.92. So, we are in the black by \$37,027.79.

Currently we have a mortgage balance of \$75,572.91. We have \$30,773.98 in our mortgage fund, and a monthly payment of \$4,111. Thus, we have funds on hand to
