This Advent season we are following the theme, "How Does a Weary World Rejoice?" from A Sanctified Art LLC. A Sanctified Art believes God speaks to us through many mediums and that creativity is an integral part of worship. They create curriculum and worship resources, including the Advent Devotionals found in the Narthex. The Call to Worship and Candle Lighting Liturgy, Prayer of Confession, and Affirmation of Faith are adapted from prayers written by Sarah (Are) Speed of A Sanctified Art.

OH WEARY SOUL RETURN Anna Strickland, of Sanctified Art, wrote this original hymn text, connecting images from scripture and our Christmas theme to go with a familiar Advent hymn tune.

Notes on Today's Music:

The **Opening Voluntary** is based melody and text first found as a single stanza of eight line (as translated above) in collection of German psalms and motets compiled by Clemens Stephani (1530-1592) and published in Nürnberg, Germany in 1568. This setting by J. S. Bach was composed between 1708 and 1714 during his time as court organist at Weimar. It is only one of four "ornamented chorales" in Das Orgel-Büchlein, Bach's pedagogical guide to creating chorale preludes for Lutheran hymns. It was planned to set 164 chorales for the liturgical year; sadly, only 46 were completed.

The **Benediction in Music** is based on a 14th century German carol setting a Medieval Latin text. It belongs to a group of carols referred to as "macaronic" (using two languages) believed to have been written by the German mystic Heinrich Seuse c. 1328. The tune first appears in Codex 1305, a manuscript in Leipzig University Library dating from c. 1400, although it has been suggested that the melody may have existed in Europe prior to this date.

This setting is by Dale Wood (1934-2003) who was a composer, organist, and choral director best know for his church music compositions.
