## From the Pastor

That first Christmas Eve of the pandemic was surreal. I took this picture late on the evening of December 24, 2020. Everyone else in my house was asleep except my curious old cat, Harley, who you can see peeking out on the left side. It felt so strange to be home watching our pre-recorded worship service



with candlelight and communion from home. I put a nice cloth on our coffee table. I lit the candles on the set of German angel chimes that are older than I am and the other two sets I bought the winter before when our youth group went to the Christkindl Market. I had red wine in a real glass and a small loaf of honey wheat bread from Outback Steakhouse. One of the beautiful things about the way we did pre-recorded worship was that I didn't always know what was coming. We planned worship together, but David Lukens edited it all on his own. So, when I heard Kjersti Lukens' voice singing "O Holy Night" during communion, it touched me. I have always felt a special connection to that song, but in 2020, the words "the weary world rejoices" hit me differently. Nine months into the pandemic, with racial reckoning across the country and political uprising, the world *was* weary. How could it rejoice?

Acknowledging that the Christmas season is often an emotionally charged time when we can feel many things deeply at the same time, the women behind Sanctified Art describe this year's theme:

"Joy is often a companion to many other emotions. We can feel joy in addition to feeling many other things at once: grief, anticipation, anxiety, excitement, disappointment, and exhaustion. Perhaps many of us live with the myth



that joy is not something we deserve—or that it is wholly out of reach. But our joy is rooted in the truth that we belong to God. Can you tether yourself to that deep truth? You deserve to feel joy—fully. The world needs your joy, even if you are weary. Our joy is better when it is shared."

This theme, of course, alludes to a line in the familiar Christmas hymn, "O Holy Night," which has an interesting history. The song was originally written by a French poet who was an atheist, and the music was supplied by a Jewish composer. The hymn was later translated into English by an American Unitarian minister. In the 1800s, it became a popular hymn for Christian abolitionists due to its justice-focused language in verse 3. Like Mary's song, the hymn reminds us that justice and joy belong together. Sometimes our joy is an act of resistance. And so, this Advent, we will hold space for our weariness and our joy.

We will seek a "thrill of hope" in our hurting world. We will welcome joy —even and especially if, like the prophet Isaiah, we cry out for comfort (Isaiah 40:1). In this weary world, may we find many ways to rejoice.

This year, you can observe Advent with the following:

- a daily devotional with scripture, poetry prayers, visual art, coloring, written reflections, action, and journaling prompts
- a calendar for children and families (and anyone else who wants one)
- daily posts on the church's Instagram and Facebook pages

I hope you will join us this advent season and for our special Christmas Eve worship services as we ask the question of ourselves and our community: *How does a weary world rejoice?*

# Vital Congregations Initiative December's Congregational Survey

The last Sunday in November we culminated our month-long reflection on St. Andrew's history and legacy with a Service of Commemoration & Celebration. It was a wonderful time of testimonies and reflections on St. Andrews' past ministries, and a

May the Spirit motivate us all to participate fully and transparently in this phase of measuring our vitality.





# New Bible Study Group Forming in January

An extended study of the Bible book of Revelation will be held at SAPC, in the meeting room, beginning January 7, 2024 at 2:00 p.m. The recorded instruction by Bruce Gore lasts for about an hour with discussion, moderated by Arch Baker, to follow. Bruce Gore is a seminary faculty member with extensive experience in the Reformed Tradition.

The class will take an in-depth historical-analytical approach to Revelation exploring the history of interpretation and history of tradition aspects of the book. Gore's presentations are informative and engaging and will help the class to understand why the book was written and what it says to modern-day study. We will begin with a video presentation of the various interpretations (some absolutely bizarre) of Revelation.

Our ultimate goal is to understand the book as it would have been understood by its first readers/hearers. If you want to prepare, you can begin by reading the books of Daniel and Ezekiel in the Bible. See you at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday afternoon, Jan. 7th. If you miss a session or two, that's OK as Bruce always reviews each previous section. This is going to be fun!

The Session met twice on November 19, 2023. A called meeting was held in-person in the Meeting Room at 11:15 a.m. to welcome new members. Scott Johnson joined by transfer of letter from the Church of the New Covenant, and Fernando and Kayla Chen by Reaffirmation of Faith. We welcome them, and look forward to working together at St. Andrews.

Our stated session meeting was held by Zoom at 1:00 p.m. In addition to times of prayer, the Session approved the following motions:

- The session approved a motion to accept Jim Connor's resignation from the Session, with our thanks for his service.
- A motion to add a new Presbytery Policy for Paid Family Medical Leave for Pastors to the SAPC Operations Manual as a Policy of the Session was discussed and approved.

Moving to items for discussion, the proposed 2024 budget as approved by the Management Ministry was presented by J. Thomas, Treasurer. After thoughtful discussion of changes that might be needed to facilitate new projects founded on the work of the Vital Congregations Initiative, the budget was approved as presented. Moving forward, the Session will monitor any new budgetary changes needed and make adjustments to the working budget as needed and approved.

D. Brilling led a discussion about the need for additional Communion servers during the Advent season. Several Elders volunteered to serve on specific dates, and others volunteered to serve as needed for other dates.

Since our last meeting, members were asked to contribute to the timeline of SAPC over the past 60 years. Our timeline now shows when members joined the church, as well as many examples of past activities and memories. As we take the next steps of visioning, the timeline will continue to be available for viewing in the church parlor. If you have not had time to look at it, please do spend time to review all the adventures of our past as we continue to plan for our future together.
