# MUSICAL OFFERING

Hallelujah is from Beethoven's oratorio Christus am Ölberge (Christ on the Mount of Olives), which premiered during Holy Week in 1803. In this Passion play, the Passion itself is not depicted; the focus is on Jesus' spiritual struggle beforehand in the Garden of Gethsemane.

#### THINE IS THE GLORY

This Easter text was written to fit the music of Handel's composition in 1884. It grew widely popular following its use at the First Assembly of the World Council of Churches in 1948.

### COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

In the act of remembering that is the Lord's Supper, we receive and trust the love of Christ present to us and to the world. Through it, we are renewed and empowered to be the church, the body of Christ, in the world.
