COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

In the act of remembering that is the Lord's Supper, we receive and trust the love of Christ present to us and to the world. Through it, we are renewed and empowered to be the church, the body of Christ, in the world.

The invitation to the Lord's Supper is not just for Presbyterians or "members of the church." All who confess Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord are invited to partake of the Lord's Supper. Access to the Table is not a right conferred upon the worthy but a privilege given to the undeserving who come in faith, repentance, and love. Even one who doubts or whose trust is wavering may receive the bread and grape juice (in place of wine) to be assured of God's love and grace in Jesus Christ.

All are invited to the Lord's Table to receive Communion, which is served by intinction. Congregants proceed via the center aisle to receive the bread (glutenfree bread and individual cups of juice are available at the center station), which they then dip into the chalice of nonalcoholic grape juice. Worshipers return to their pews by the side aisles. If you are unable to come forward to receive communion, we will come to you in your seat.

Notes on Today's Music

The **Opening Voluntary** is based on the hymn tune NETTLETON, the composer of which is unknown. It was first published in Repository of Sacred Music, Second Part, (Harrisburg, PA, 1813), a compilation edited by John Wyeth (1770-1858). The tune name honors Asahel Nettleton (1783-1844) a well-known evangelist and compiler of the words-only collection *Village Hymns for Social Worship* (New Haven, CT, 1824).

The arrangement is by Dale Wood (1934-2003), an American composer, organist, and choral director best known for his church music compositions.

The **Musical Offering** was composed in 1999 by Craig Courtney (b. 1948) based on words from Job 19:25-26 and I Corinthians 13:12 and employing the Alleluia from EASTER HYMN as an opening and closing motif. He is currently a Composer and the Executive Music Editor for Beckenhorst Press, and his music is performed all over the world. His published works include more than two hundred choral octavos, nine vocal collections, a piano solo collection and six extended works for choir and orchestra.

The **Benediction in Music** is based on the hymn tune AMSTERDAM first published in the Foundery Collection, 1742. The text for the hymn was written by Charles Wesley (1707-1788), the great hymn-writer of the Wesley family, and perhaps, taking quantity and quality into consideration, the great hymn-writer of all ages. The *Foundery Collection* was so named because the Wesley's purchased an unused canon foundry and restored it as a gathering center for preaching and learning. In essence, it is the first distinctly Methodist hymn book.
