#### MUSICAL OFFERING

It was intended as a communion hymn as evidenced by the original title *The Sacrifice of Praise* with the refrain "Christ, Our God, to thee we raise/This our sacrifice of praise," drawing on the language of Hebrews 13:15.

The words of 2 Corinthians 5:17 are echoed in the first and last stanzas of this hymn. Just as Paul declared, "If anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation," this hymn declare that the new creation is already present and calls us to respond in a song and life of gratitude.
