AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Following the proclamation of the Word, the congregation is given the opportunity to respond to hearing God's Word by affirming what the church believes and expressing our faith. Today's responsive affirmation is adapted from The Theological Declaration of Barmen, which was written to help Christians withstand the challenges of the Nazi party In May of 1934 delegates representing Lutheran, Reformed, and United churches from around Germany assembled in the town of Barmen to proclaim their faith in Jesus Christ. The Declaration, written primarily by Karl Barth, affirmed that while Christians must still listen to the surrounding culture, Christ is ultimately the only one to whom the church owes obedience. The church should not hand over its message to the prevailing ideological convictions of the day.

Offretory

This is based on the hymn tune HIDING PLACE, which was first published in 1831 in The Christian Lyre, a book of hymns compiled by Joshua Leavitt (1794 - 1873), a Congregationalist minister who became a prominent writer, editor and publisher of abolitionist literature. It was the first American tune book to take the form of a modern hymnal, with music for every hymn (melody and bass only) and the multistanza hymns printed in full, under or beside the music.


