The Biblical names for Jesus that remain in the current hymn include: Emmanuel, Wisdom, Lord of Might, Root of Jesse, Key of David, Rising Son (Dayspring), and King (Desire) of Nations.

When the people were broken and thought God had forgotten them, a prophet called Isaiah spoke for God:

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem. Shepherd God will feed the flock, gathering up the lambs, carrying them, and leading the mother sheep.

When the people felt defeated by the tasks before them, another prophet Isaiah rose and spoke for God:

I bring good news to the oppressed from God. Mend the brokenhearted, shout liberty to all who feel locked up, comfort any who mourn, and tell everyone that the year of the Lord's favor is here.

Years later a new prophet appeared in the land. John the Baptist announced the coming of the long-awaited Messiah:
