

A list of suggested disciplines was included in the March Lamplighter. Caring for the Creation begins with prayer. Select a topic that appeals to you (the oceans, daffodils, clean water, bees, clutter, earthworms, litter) and talk to God any time of day. Pick a topic for the week or a new topic daily but include creation care in daily prayer. Find other resources at: http:// presbyearthcare.org/devotional-and-worship-aids/; http://www.gipl.org/prayers/ or in John Philip Newell's book *Praying with the Earth* which contains morning and evening prayers that invite meditation and daily prayer for all of creation.
