PALM/PASSION SUNDAY

Today we commence our Holy Week journey to Easter. We begin with Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. But before the week is through, those shouts from the crowds with change from "Hosanna!" to "Crucify him!" This service will move us from Palms to Passion (suffering) as we await shouts of a different kind on Easter morning.

ALL GLORY, LAUD, AND HONOR

The text dates from about 820 AD, and was written by Theodulph, the Bishop of Orleans in France under the emperor Charlemagne. The music was composed by Melchior Teschner, who was a musician of considerable ability and was greatly interested in enriching public worship. The tune first appeared in a small tract published in 1615, quickly became popular, and is found in many choral books and hymnals dating from the late 1600's.

CONFESSING OUR SIN

God of our salvation, we grasp our coveted, once-a-year, palm branches. We sing and shout, "Hosanna!" We proclaim in those moments that we want you to save us, but we're not always sure you under stand what we mean. You have come to vanquish the status quo, but we have been comfortable in that life. You have come to turn the world upside down, but we're afraid you will shake things up more than we intended. You have come to draw us closer to your vision for creation, but, at times, we think you may be just a little too impassioned. We like the palm branches. We even like the hymns. But we just want to go home after the parade. Forgive our lack of vision. Forgive our lukewarm passion and inspire us to step off the curb and to start marching at your side.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

The invitation to the Lord's Supper is not just for Presbyterians or church members. All who confess Iesus Christ as Savior and Lord are invited to partake of the Lord's Supper. Access to the Table is not a right conferred upon the worthy but a privilege given to the undeserving who come in faith, repentance, and love. Even one who doubts or whose trust is wavering may receive the bread and cup in order to be assured of God's love and grace in Jesus Christ.

All are invited to the Lord's Table to receive Communion, which is served by intinction today. Congregants proceed via the center aisle to receive the bread (both gluten-free and regular bread are available at the center station), which they then dip into the chalice of nonalcoholic grape juice. Worshipers return to their pews by the side aisles.

RIDE ON!

This triumphant hymn, played in a minor key, rather than the key in which it was written, sets the tone for Maundy Thursday and Good Friday on our way to Easter.

The Sixth Great End of the Church

The exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven to the world.

The dove is in flight over the globe, carrying an olive branch, echoing Gen. 8:11: "And lo, in her mouth a freshly plucked olive leaf; so No-ah knew that the waters had subsided from the earth." This represents the eighth day of creation, God's grace coming into the world, the reign of God proclaimed by Jesus Christ. The light rising behind the earth represents the dawning of God's kingdom.
