COVENANT VOWS

For the St. Andrews Church Worshiping Community:

With our worshiping children, will you take time to explain the different parts of worship and be open to answering their questions, and if you don't know the answer, will you ask the worship leaders together?

As a parent of a St. Andrews child, will you regularly remind your children of our worshipping covenant and how to respectfully participate in our faith community and encourage ways for them to assist in leading worship as they are ready?

Will you use all worship materials appropriately and take care to return everything in good shape and If you choose to participate in the pray-ground, will you listen to the shepherds guiding you in worship, engage in your activities quietly, and respect the space and materials?

Will you participate in the movements and rituals of worship and when you are curious about something we do in worship, ask your parent or other trusted adult for understanding.
