†AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

"Fear God. Honor the emperor." Scripture tells us that, in the as yet unredeemed world in which the church also exists, the State has by divine appointment the task of providing for justice and peace. It fulfills this task by means of the threat and exercise of force, according to the measure of human judgment and human ability.

The church's commission, upon which its freedom is founded, consists in delivering the message of the free grace of God to all people in Christ's stead, and therefore in the ministry of his own Word and work through sermon and Sacrament.

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Today's responsive affirmation is adapted from The Theological Declaration of Barmen, which was written to help Christians withstand the challenges of the Nazi party. In May of 1934 delegates representing Lutheran, Reformed, and United churches from around Germany assembled in the town of Barmen to proclaim their faith in Jesus Christ. The Declaration, written primarily by Karl Barth, affirmed that while Christians must still listen to the surrounding culture, Christ is ultimately the only one to whom the church owes obedience. The church should not hand over its message to the prevailing ideological convictions of the day. This affirmation is proper on this particular day in the church year when we affirm the Reign and Lordship of Christ.
