Notes on Today's Music

Opening Voluntary William Batchelder Bradbury (1816-1868) is best known as a composer and publisher of a series of musical collections for choirs and schools. He was the author and compiler of fifty-nine books. He composed many tunes, including those for "He Leadeth Me"; "Just As I Am"; "Sweet Hour of Prayer" "Savior, Like a Shepherd Lead Us" and "My Hope Is Built on Nothing Less", all of which can still be found in hymnbooks and songbooks today. In 1862, Bradbury found the poem "Jesus Loves Me". Bradbury wrote the music and added the chorus: "Yes, Jesus loves me, ..." The arrangement is by Dale Wood (1934-2003), an American composer, organist, and choral director best known for his church music compositions.

The text of the **Joyful Response** was written by Fred Pratt Scott (1903-2000) an ordained minister of the Methodist Church in Britain, He is one of the best-known of the contemporary school of hymn writers in the British Isles. His name and writings appear in practically every new hymnal and "hymn supplement" wherever English is spoken and sung. This text was written in 1969 and was first published London in 1971. There are 11 hymns in our hymnal from his pen. The music was composed by William Knapp (1698-1768), an English composer of anthems, hymns, and psalm tunes.

The **Benediction in Music** is a setting of the hymn "Praise, My Soul, the King of Heaven" with a a new tune, ANDREWS, composed by Mark Andrews (b. 1930). This tune first appeared in the 1986 *Great Songs Revised* edited by Forrest M. McCann. The text of the hymn, a paraphrase of Psalm 103, is by Henry Francis Lyte (1793-1847) was first published in *The Spirit of the Psalms* (London, 1834).

This setting is by Anna Laura Page (b. 1943), active as a composer, clinician, and organist. Her publications include choral works for children, youth and adults, and compositions for handbells, organ, and piano.
