Notes on Today's Music

The **Opening Voluntary** is based on the tune BEACHSPRING attributed to Benjamin Franklin White. It first appeared in The Sacred Harp (Philadelphia, 1844), a compilation of hymns and songs written in shaped notes. The term "sacred harp" refers to the human voice — that is, the musical instrument you were given at birth. Sacred harp singing is a tradition of sacred choral music that originated in New England and was later perpetuated and carried on in the American South. The name is derived from the historically important tune book printed in shape notes, which is a musical notation that uses note heads in 4 distinct shapes to aid in sight-reading.

The arrangement is by Dale Wood (1934-2003), an American composer, organist, and choral director best known for his church music compositions.

The basis of the text of **The God of Abraham Praise** dates from the pen of the 12th century rabbi Moses Maimonides. The current English words convey the essence of the canticle *Yigdal Ewlohim chai ve'yishtabach*, a set of thirteen articles of Jewish faith which speak to the nature of God. The tune is a 17th century Jewish melody adapted by Meyer Lyon (1751-1796) and Thomas Olivers (1725-1799).

Authored by Mary Louise Bringle (b. 1953), **God Is Calling through the Whisper** was written at the request of the editor of a resource for corporate worship for a hymn on the theme of "calling". Her response with this text points out how God's call may not come to us in literal words, but may appear in the beauties of art and nature.

w żŁOBIE LEŻY is a traditional Polish carol which is believed to be as old as the 13th century. It's present day version was first published in *The Hymnal Companion to the Book of Common Prayer* (London, 1877)

**I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say "Come unto me and rest"** was written by Horatius Bonar (1808 - 1889) and first published in *Hymns Original and Selected* (London, 1846). It is perhaps the best-known and best-loved of the six hundred hymns Bonar is said to have written. The first half of each stanza is devoted to something heard from Jesus, and the second half is the singer's response.

The tune KINGSFOLD is and English melody which was first published in *English Country Songs* (London, 1893) and harmonized by Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872-1958) in *The English Hymnal* (London, 1906)

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
