Notes on Today's Music

The **Opening Voluntary** was composed by Dr. Eugene Butler (born 1935), an American a composer, conductor, educator and church musician, has established a solid and respected position in the music world. This piece was composed in 2016.

A fughetta is a short fugue (i.e.: imitative counterpoint) with an exposition plus only a few restatements of the subject.

First Hymn Much of the imagery in this hymn, created by Reginald Heber (1783-1826), comes from Revelation 4:2-11 which the author, an Anglican bishop and hymnodist, knew as the appointed reading for Trinity Sunday.

The tune was composed by John Bacchus Dykes (1823-1876) specifically for this text. Dykes was an English clergyman and one of the main composers for new hymn texts. He composed 300 hymn tunes, five of which are in *Glory to God*.

Offertory Response The music was composed by Hal Hopson (b. 1933), a full-time composer, church musician, conductor, and clinician. He has over 3000 published works, which comprise almost every musical form in church music. With a special interest in congregational song, he continues to make a significant contribution to the new repertoire of hymn tunes and responsorial psalm settings.

The text for *Immortal, Invisible. God Only Wise* was written by William Chalmers Smith (1824-1908) and published in his book *Hymns of Christ and the Christian Life* (London, 1867). He was a hymnist, author, poet, and minister of the Free Church of Scotland.

The Free Church of Scotland was a Scottish denomination which was formed in 1843 by a large withdrawal from the established Church of Scotland in a schism or division known as the Disruption of 1843. In 1900 the vast majority of the Free Church of Scotland joined with the United Presbyterian Church of Scotland.

The music is a traditional Welsh folk melody which first appeared in *Caniadau y Cyssegr* (Songs of the Sanctuary) edited by John Roberts (Denbigh, Wales. 1839).

The **Benediction in Music** was composed by Johann Gottfried Walther (1684 - 1748), a German music theorist, organist, composer, and lexicographer of the Baroque era. Not only was his life almost exactly contemporaneous to that of Johann Sebastian Bach, he was the famous composer's cousin. He is considered among the most distinguished musical scholars of his time. His *Musicalisches Lexicon* was the first important comprehensive German music dictionary.

"Was Gott tut, das ist wohlgetan" (literal translation: What God does, that is well done) is a Lutheran hymn written by the pietist German poet and schoolmaster Samuel Rodigast (1649-1708). The melody has been attributed to Severus Gastorius (1646-1682), a cantor in the town of Jena, Thuringia, a state in Germany.
