Notes on Today's Music

The text for our **Opening Voluntary**, "Morning Has Broken," was created by Eleanor Farjeon (1881-1965) at the request of the editor of a new hymnal to fit this melody. Originally titled "Thanks for a Day," it reflects the authors awareness of the potential of each new day to recall the wonder of creation.

Another text, "Baptized in Water," was written by Michael Saward (1932-2015) in 1981, which was first published in *Hymns for Today's Church* (London, 1982).

Both texts are apropos to today's sermon.

The 19th century Gaelic melody was reportedly collected from the singing of a wandering Scottish highlander. The tune, BUNESSAN, is named for a small village on the Isle of Mull, off the west coast of Scotland.

Charles Callahan (b. 1951) is well-known as an award-winning composer, organist, choral conductor, pianist, and teacher.

The text of **The Church's One Foundation** was written by Samuel John Stone (1839-1900), an English cleric, as one of twelve hymns affirming the articles of the Apostle's Creed with biblical allusions such as I Corinthians 3:11 in this case. The tune AURELIA, composed by Samuel Sebastian Wesley (1810-1876), though not created for this text, was joined to it in 1868, and the two have been inseparable ever since.

The text for **Breath on Me, Breath of God** was written by Edwin Hatch (1835-1889). The initial appearance of the text is as the first of thirteen pieces in a privately printed collection of his poems *Between Doubt and Prayer*.

The tune TRENTHAM was composed by Robert Jackson (1840-1914) and was first published in a collection of original tunes by Jackson: Sacred Leaflets for Church and Home: Fifty Original Hymn Tunes (London, 1888).
