Notes on Today's Music

The **Opening Voluntary** is based on a hymn-tune from *The Southern Harmony*, a shape note hymn and tune book compiled by William Walker, first published in 1835. The text is an American folk hymn c. 1811 and is an unbounded declaration of the breadth of God's love and grace.

The setting was composed by David N. Johnson (1922 - 1987), an American organist, composer, educator, choral clinician, and lecturer. Johnson published well over 300 compositions, most of them for church use, and was author of an *Instruction Book for Beginning Organists* (1964) and an *Organ Teacher's Guide* (1971).

The text for **Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise** was written by William Chalmers Smith (1824-1908) and published in his book *Hymns of Christ and the Christian Life* (London, 1867). He was a hymnist, author, poet, and minister of the Free Church of Scotland. The Free Church of Scotland was a Scottish denomination which was formed in 1843 by a large withdrawal from the established Church of Scotland in a schism or division known as the Disruption of 1843. In 1900 the vast majority of the Free Church of Scotland joined with the United Presbyterian Church of Scotland.

The music is a traditional Welsh folk melody which first appeared in *Caniadau y Cyssegr* (Songs of the Sanctuary) edited by John Roberts (Denbigh, Wales. 1839).

The text of **Blessed Assurance**, **Jesus Is Mine** was written by Fanny Jane Crosby (1820-1915), an American mission worker, poet, lyricist, and composer. She was a prolific hymnist, writing more than 8,000 hymns and gospel songs, with more than 100 million copies printed. She is also known for her teaching and her rescue mission work.

The music was composed by Phoebe Palmer Knapp (1839-1908), an American musician and the composer of 500 tunes, primarily music for hymns. She married a wealthy businessman and used her wealth and position to support the arts and budding artisans.
