Notes on Today's Music

The composer for the hymn tune NETTLETON in today's **Opening Voluntary** is unknown. It was first published in *Repository of Sacred Music, Second Part*, (Harrisburg, PA, 1813), a compilation edited by John Wyeth (1770- 1858). It is yet another hymn tune in AABA form. The tune name honors Asahel Nettleton (1783-1844) a well-known evangelist and compiler of the words-only collection *Village Hymns for Social Worship* (New Haven, CT, 1824).

The arrangement is by Dale Wood (1934-2003), an American composer, organist, and choral director best known for his church music compositions.

The text for **In an Age of Twisted Values** was authored by Martin Leckebusch (b 1962), originally titled "Heal Our Nation", and was first published in *New Start Hymns and Songs* (Stowmarket, Suffolk, 1999).

The tune CHURCH UNITED was composed by Alfred Fedak (b. 1953) in 1987 and published in Songs of Rejoicing (New Brunswick, NJ, 1989). The tune is named for the United Reformed Church in Somerville, New Jersey where the composer and his wife then served as ministers of music.

The **Joyful Response** employs the hymn tune AZMON by Carl Gotthelf Gläser (1784-1829) which was first published in The Modern Psalmist (Boston, 1839), and was complied and edited by Lowell Mason (1792-1872). The text for "O for a Thousand Tongues to Sing" was written by Charles Wesley (1797-1788).

The text of **How Clear Is Our Vocation**, **Lord** was composed by Fred Pratt Green (1903-2000) as a reflection on Christian vocation in response to a request for new words to the existing tune REPTON composed by C. Hubert H. Parry (1848-1918) The tune is named for a noted British boarding school, whose music director was a friend of the composer.

The text for **God Be with You Till We Meet Again** was authored by Jeremiah Rankin (1824-1904), a North American Congregational minister.

The tune was composed by the famous English composer Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872-1958).
