SEEK YE FIRST

This text is one of the classic examples of the 20thcentury trend of setting Scripture (Matthew 6:33 in this case) to music. We usually abstain from using the word alleluia during Lent. However, the text and tone of this hymn are so well suited for our Lenten theme that we made an exception. Additionally, the 40 days of Lent do not include Sundays because every Sunday is a "little Easter," so alleluia is appropriate.

LENTEN THEME AND LITURGY

This Lenten season we are following the theme, "Seeking: honest questions for deeper faith," from A Sanctified Art, LLC. This ministry believes that God speaks to us through many mediums and that creativity is an integral part of worship. The Call to Worship, Prayer of Confession, and Affirmation of Faith are adapted from prayers written by Sarah (Are) Speed of A Sanctified Art.

DECLARATION OF FORGIVENESS

Family of faith, as hard as it is to imagine: we could lose the bucket, we could hoard the water for ourselves, we could pretend we do not see all who are thirsty, and we would still belong to God. This is the good news of the gospel:



COMMUNION OF THE PEOPLE

In the act of remembering that is the Lord's Supper, we receive and trust the love of Christ present to us and the world. Through it, we are renewed and empowered to be the church, the body of Christ, in the world.

The invitation is not just for Presbyterians or "church members." Access to the Table is not a right conferred upon the worthy but a privilege given to the undeserving who come in faith, repentance, and love. All are invited to receive the bread and cup, regardless of age or understanding, to be assured of God's love and grace in Jesus Christ.

Today, communion will be served by intinction. Congregants proceed via the center aisle to receive the bread (gluten-free bread and individual cups of juice are available), which they then dip into the chalice of non-alcoholic grape juice. Worshipers return to their pews by the side aisles. If you are unable to come forward to receive communion, we will come to you in your seat.
