Notes on Today's Music

The **Opening Voluntary** is setting of the traditional Irish folk melody first published in *Old Irish Folk Music and Songs* in 1909 It was first wedded with the words of an Irish rune dating from the 8th century in *The Irish Church Hymnal* (Dublin, 1919) when the tune was named SLANE.

This arrangement for handbells was composed in 2003 by Lloyd Larson (b 1954). Since 1982, Lloyd has been an active composer and arranger for several major publishing companies of church and school music, including more than 2,000 published works.

The text for the **Musical Offering**, "Be Thou My Vision," - *Rop tú mo baile, a Choimdiu cride* in Irish Gaelic - is preserved in two manuscripts, both dating from the 10th or 11th century. The author of this prayer-hymn is unknown, but it is likely the work of an anonymous Irish monk from around the 8th century. The rhymed version we use was translated by Eleanor Hull in 1912. This setting is by Carlton Young (1926-2023), a teacher, editor, composer, and conductor, has the unique distinction of serving as editor of two revisions of hymnals for Methodists: *The Methodist Hymnal*, 1966; and *The United Methodist Hymnal*, 1989. Dr. Young has served on several faculties and is Emeritus Professor of Church Music, Candler School of Theology, Emory University.

The **Offertory** is based on the well-known hymn tune by William M. Runyan (1870 -1957) in an arrangement for handbells by Cynthia Dobrinski (1950-2021). Runyan was the son of a Methodist minister. He showed an interest in music when very young, and by age 12 often served as church organist. He became a Methodist minister at 21, and held various pastorates in Kansas (1891-1903). Dobrinsi was an American composer and arranger of handbell music with more than 175 works in print. She was a Fulbright scholar and taught for 15 years at the Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas.

The text of the hymn on which the **Benediction in Music** is based was written in 1676 by Samuel Rodigast (1649-1708), a German teacher and hymnwriter. It was written to comfort a sick friend. The text and music first appear in the *Weimar Gesangbuch*, 1681. In it Rodigast lays out what it means to deal with the problem of pain and suffering through the perspective of faith. Our God is sovereign and full of love, and every circumstance he brings us through is good and right and true. The melody has been attributed to Severus Gastorius (1646-1682), a cantor in the town of Jena, Thuringia, a state in Germany.

A relatively new addition to our hymnody, this song has become an important part of many ordination and confirmation worship services. Historically, each session meeting here at St. Andrews concludes with everyone joining hands and singing the refrain based on the call of Isaiah (6:8).
