#### Notes on Today's Music

The text for the **Opening Voluntary** "This is My Father's World" was written by Maltbie D. Babcock (1858-1901) and is from a collection of this Presbyterian's pastor's writings which was published posthumously. The recurring phrase was his customary was of identifying what he was going out to see on his morning walks. The tune TERRA BEATA was composed by Franklin L. Sheppard (1852-1930), a friend of the author, for these words. It first appeared in a Presbyterian Sunday School hymnal (1915) which the composer edited.

This setting was arranged for piano and organ by the team of Tedd Smith (b. 1927; London, Ontario, Canada) and Don Hustad (1918-2013).

The text for the **Musical Offering** "For the Beauty of the Earth" was written by Folliott Sandford Pierpoint (1835-1917) and first published in London in 1864. The original title was "Sacrifice of Praise" and the original refrain was "Christ our God, to Thee we raise / This our Sacrifice of Praise" which expresses the original intent as a eucharistic hymn.

This setting is by John Rutter (b. 1945), an internationally renowned English composer and conductor, associated mainly with choral music. His larger choral works, Gloria, Requiem, Magnificat and Mass of the Children are widely performed around the world, and many of his shorter pieces such as The Lord bless you and keep you, For the beauty of the earth, and All things bright and beautiful have become 'standards'. He has also composed or arranged many Christmas carols.

The **Benediction in Music**, based on the well-known melody created to provide a choral setting of J. C. F. Schiller's poem, *An die Freude* (To Joy), as the final movement of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony. The text we sing was written by Henry van Dyke (1852-1933), a prominent American Presbyterian pastor, author, educator, and diplomat.

This setting was composed by Matthew Corl (b. 1965), a respected organist, recitalist, and composer. The theme is set in an interesting variation between 6/8 and 3/4.
